Welcome to the 2021-22 hockey season. My name is Chris Robinson and I am excited and looking forward to coaching the Kanata Blazers U12 A team. Below I have included some information about me, my coaching philosophy, the evaluation and tryout process and expectations for the upcoming season.

I have been playing hockey for as long as I can remember and have been involved with various KMHA teams as on-ice helper, trainer, assistant and head coach since 2013. I have enjoyed my time and learned a lot over the course these seasons from both the players and coaches and hope to bring the lessons I've learned to this team. It is an honour to be given the opportunity to coach this team and I look forward to another great experience this season.

My coaching philosophy is one that is focused on helping every player achieve their full potential both on and off the ice in positive and fun environment. This philosophy is one that is based on:

- · Attitude: Bring a positive attitude to all team activities and have a willingness to learn and improve at all times.
- Effort: Give 100% effort on and off the ice for all practices and games
- Respect: Coaches, Teammates, Officials and Opponents

My objective is to provide each player with the opportunity to improve their hockey skills through well designed practices that focus not only on individual skills but also team play and tactics, as well as providing everyone an opportunity to play in different games scenarios. Hockey is a team sport and my objective is to ensure every player on this team is provided the opportunity to contribute to the team's success. I also strive to provide the players with the opportunity to voice their opinions and suggestions in order to give them the opportunity to take a leadership/ownership role on the ice and in the dressing room. I strongly believe that the lessons taught through minor hockey should not only be focused on improving a player's ability as a hockey player but also improve skills that are transferable to life outside the rink. In addition, we will also compete in 3 to 4 tournaments, 1-2 of which will be out of town. The tournament dates will be communicated once registration has been finalized.

The financial commitment for families (in addition to KMHA registration and tryout costs) will be approximately \$1350 - \$1500 depending on the level of fundraising or sponsorship. These fees will be used for ice times, officials, tournaments and other team activities/requirements.
