

The **Kanata Bantam Charity Tournament** began in 2011/12, with 16 teams competing. A dedicated group of volunteers helped make the tournament a huge success with **\$7,675** raised in its first year.

Since then it has grown to 36 teams and has raised a total of \$76,902.48 and counting.

We have been able to offer support to charities and community services such as The Youth Services Board of Ottawa in memory of Kanata teen Jamie Hubley as well as the Ruddy-Shenkman Hospice in Kanata and "Hopes Rising" a campaign for mental health at the Queensway Carleton Hospital.

This year the Kanata Bantam Charity Tournament will be supporting two equally wonderful causes in memory of Michaela Martel. The Big Brothers and Big Sisters along with the Youth Services Bureau to support mental health will both benefit from your participation in our tournament.

We thank you in advance for helping us make a difference in our community and in the lives of our youth through Hockey.
