Financial Statement Report- Annette Jensen MKP Accounting Professionals

We have audited the financial statements of Kanata Minor Hockey Association, which comprise the statements of financial position as at April 30, 2022 and April 30, 2021 and the statements of fund operations and changes in net assets (operating and capital asset fund) and statement of cash flows for the years then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion, except for the effect of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph (in Schedule 2), these financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Kanata Minor Hockey Association as at April 30, 2022 and April 30, 2021 and the results of its operations and cash flows for the years then ended, in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations.

Treasurer- Chris Greenwood

Ice cost were a very significant (71%- 2021/22). total of our operating budget (Usual is 58%) but due to the challenges we had with the closures due to Covid it increased. Looking at this past season the cost has decreased to 61 % of our total operating budget so we are heading back to down to where we want to be for ice costs. Our operation costs are quite flexible but our Administration costs are fairly fixed.

Our revenues for registration are still coming up short from where we were in 2020 (pre pandemic) this has a lot to do with U18's that aged out and a lower number of U7's coming in. Hopefully the First Shift Program will drive our registration increases moving forward. We are hoping to build up our participant base moving forward.

2022 represents our 3rd year of consecutive losses. Although we do see a trend of starting to come out of it, this year we are again expecting a loss. The challenge we are facing moving forward is to find away to make our fees enough to cover our expenses and increased costs. This year we did not anticipate the increase in ice costs and therefore our registration fees were not enough to cover the increases. We will work harder on budget forecasting moving forward. Our goal is to find creative ways to fundraise and build up our Capital Asset Fund and maintain a healthy Operating Budget moving forward.

This year we purchased new competitive jerseys which came out of our Capital Asset Fund, (233 k) we now need to build our depleted Capital Asset Fund (which now has 100K)

The future is looking brighter for KMHA, we simply need to find a way to keep ahead of the expense curve and the Ice costs going forward.

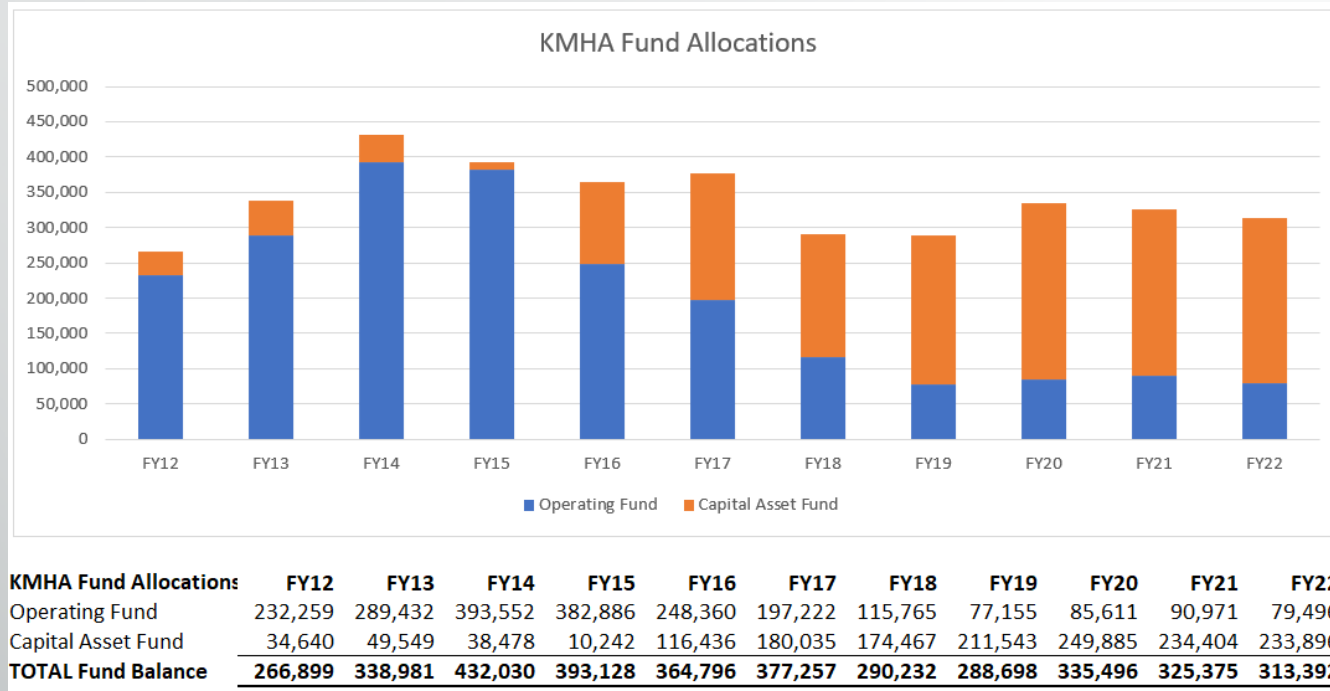

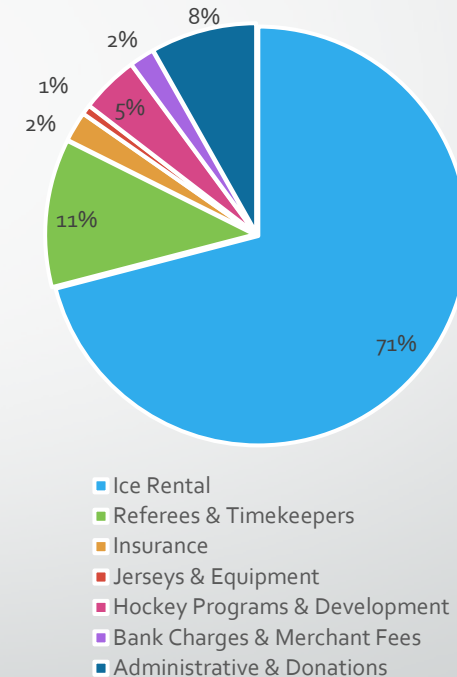

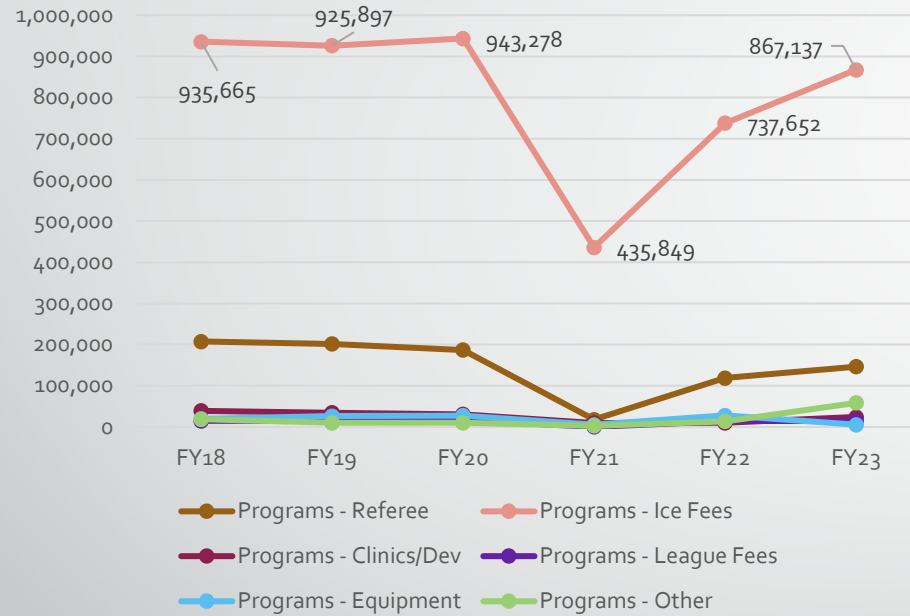
Registration Fee Breakdown 2021/22



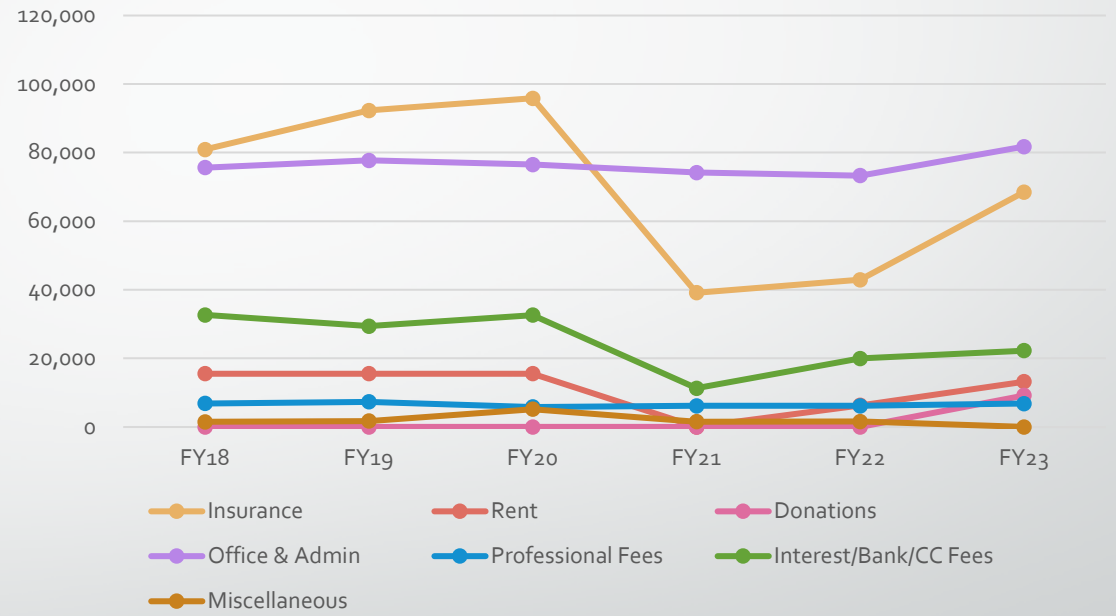
- Operating Fund contains \$40,000 CEBA loan that was repaid Fall 2022

FORECAST



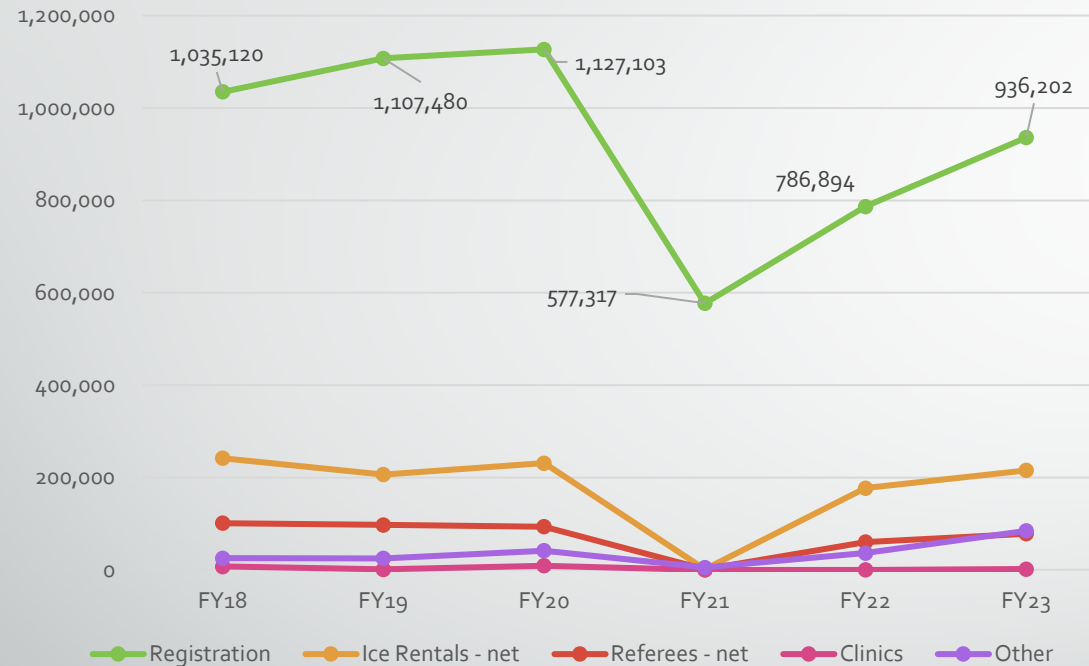
KMHA 6 Year Administration Cost Comparison to 2023
FORECAST



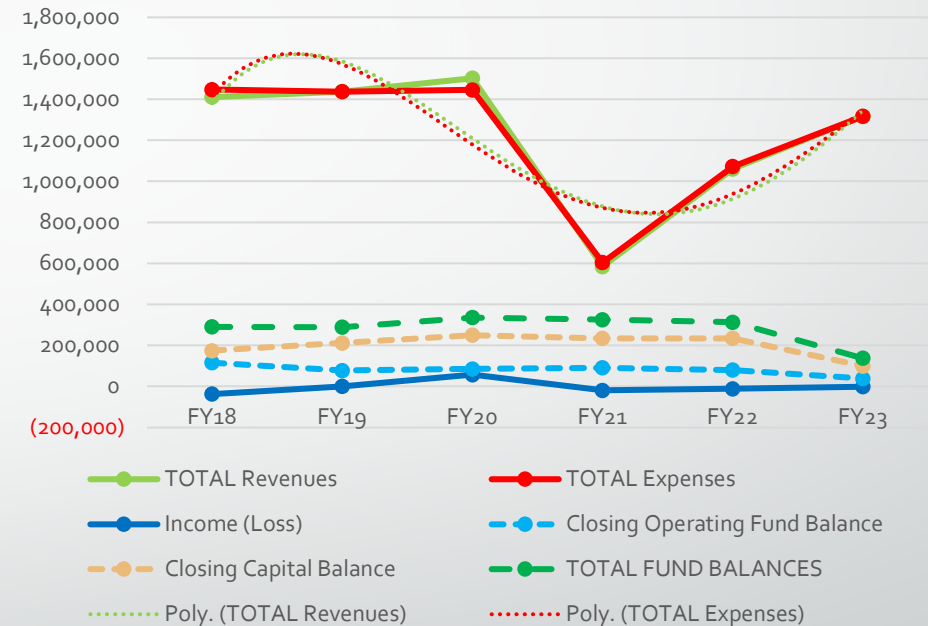
- Program Costs are mostly variable, excludes \$112K in jerseys (capital)

I would like to make a special note and let you know that I take my role of VP Hockey Programs very seriously and will continue to provide extra value to the KMHA members by providing programs with the sole intent of player development while having fun.

A special thank you to our House League Coordinator Jason Dunn and our Rep Coach Coordinator Kelly Holden, Jeff Tetzlaff for creating practice plans for all our house league teams. Also, a huge thank you to all the volunteers that spent countless hours coaching, volunteering, taking time to make our unique programs that we presented this season a success This season we had several very unique programs new to KMHA

Coach Development Series, U11, U13, U15 House League Series. U7-U9 Goalie development Series – a very special thank you to James Edge for running this very successful 2 ice time program that's main goal was to have players that might be interested in the position of goalie, come out and try the position, ask questions, put on the equipment, etc., we were expecting maybe 10 and we had 30 enroll in the event- This is will hopefully spark the interest in the position and help out with the goalie shortage that all minor hockey associations are facing.

Again, a very big thank you to all the helped out and volunteered with KMHA Hockey Programs this season.

VP Operations- Chad Mariage

Overall, the 2022/23 season, represented as close to a return to normal operations as we have seen since the pandemic started in 2020. It was fantastic to see some normalcy around the rink and in various aspects of the Association's operations. For example, this season saw the return of picture day and the U15 Charity Tournament, two important pieces for the KMHA which will be expanded upon later. My sincere thank you to all the volunteers to without them our season would not be as successful as it was.

I would like to thank Erin Murphy for serving again as registrar, I am pleased to say that we had 1191 players register this season slightly up from last year. We hope that the great additional work done this season by Hockey programs and communications will increase this number again in 2023/24.

I would like to thank Louise Foley and all the volunteers that helped with the equipment room and jersey return, hand out and jersey repairs as always, the equipment room is an area that requires hard work and time, Louise Foley your dedication and leadership in ensuring the smooth operation to the equipment room is very much appreciated. In addition to these regular tasks, Louise has been able to work on and improve processes such as equipment sign out among others and has made improvements to the room. We recently had a jersey sale in which overstocked tryout jerseys and used Rep jerseys were being sold in order to accommodate more room in the equipment room area and help recover some funds for jerseys

A special thank you to the Malcomson family- Canadian Tire Kanata for their continued support with our U7 program They supply our U7 division with jerseys and goalie gear.

Ice scheduling, I would be remiss if I did not thank Ralph Petersen once again for a job well done as our Ice Scheduler. Over 3200 ice hours of scheduling happens during the season, Ralph shared with me the spreadsheets, data base etc., and quite frankly it is daunting. Managing the ice is an incredible job with very low ice burnt hours. A special thank you to all coaches and team managers for inputting their blackout dates.

Admittedly there were many hiccups with photo pick up and delivery this season. I am in discussion with other suppliers to see what options are out there so that that moving forward we can offer you the best service and delivery. I welcome any comments as it relates to the photos and phot day.

The U15 Charity tournament came back after several years of hiatus due to the pandemic. I created a new brand for the tournament and a new logo. Player of the game awards were ball caps with the new logo which from a visibility perspective is good branding for us. Our tournament sold out by November (tournament was in February) with 36 teams and 3 divisions. This year our donations from the tournament went to The Kanata Food Cupboard and Shepards of Good Hope (with specific focus on the Kanata Location on Castlefrank, each received a donation of \$4600.00. A huge thank you to the tournament sponsors- Kanata Central BIA, Holiday Inn Kanata, Ottawa 67's ad Gabriel Pizza -Goldridge Avenue Kanata location. A special thank you to William Burnie and Stena Bergeron for all their time and effort. They spent the entire weekend at the tournament ensuring its success. Finally, a thank you to Nik McLean and all the officials and timekeepers that were terrific during the entire U15 Charity Tournament.

Being new to this role, my main objectives for this year were to (a) continue to inform our KMHA community of key information and events through our three main social media platforms (Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter); and (b) look for opportunities to promote KMHA and increase engagement from players and families. These goals were achieved in the following ways:

- ❖ ***Keeping families informed of tryout/sort out schedules, HEO updates, and KMHA events***
- ❖ ***Highlighting KMHA “good news stories” such as tournament wins, team building events, food drives and other charity fundraisers, and our house league championships***
- ❖ ***Requesting and posting hockey-themed Halloween and Christmas photos***
- ❖ ***Running a “Why I Love Hockey” contest (sponsored by the Ottawa 67s) to promote the sport of hockey and collect quotes and photos that can be used in future advertising campaigns***

This year also saw the return of our “KMHA Night Out” at an Ottawa Senators game, with over 600 tickets sold to KMHA players, families, and friends to watch the Sens take on the Tampa Bay Lightning on April 8th. It was a great success, and lots of fun too!

I would like to extend a big thank you to the KMHA organization and membership and Board of Directors for all their support as I was new to this role and appreciated their guidance and support. I would also like to thank the coaches and team managers for their and engagement in sharing their team stories to post on our SM platforms.

This season the focus was on Maltreatment. Maltreatment came in many forms, on Ice, off Ice, online. This has been a learning curve for myself, coaches, players team staff members and parents and will continue to be a learning process in the years to come.

I hope to spent time this summer to gather information from this past season and document and distribute to all the teams in the fall a document that will elaborate on Maltreatment, what it is, examples etc.,

Player safety continues to be a main focus with safety on the ice, and off the ice in the hallways etc. We need to all work together, coaches, officials' parents to teach our children and each other that negative vocalizing during a game and post-game will not improve the player safety situation., instead we need to have the adults contact the appropriate executive and have the process of problem resolution and mediation take place to resolve any difficult situation both on and off the ice.

Most of this season's issues have been resolved. There remain a few outstanding issues that we continue to work on and resolve.
