

Hockey Canada Development Pyramid Managing expectations:


Player Development Pyramid



NATIONAL COACH MENTOR PROGRAM

- The Hockey Mentorship Program is designed to provide Minor Hockey coaches with supplemental educational opportunities, one-on-one mentoring and to provide support in areas that have been identified by hockey experts across the country as "hot" issues in today's game.
- The program is also designed to bridge a gap between elected volunteers, parents and coaches involved in making this game as much fun as it can possibly be for the participants.
- The mentorship program is also designed to develop a group of mentors in the Association that will be able to support the needs of beginning hockey coaches and to provide support in a variety of ways to all coaches in the association.



What is Mentoring?

NCMP DEFINITIONS

Mentor...

A wise and trusted teacher, advisor, counselor, instructor, tutor, trainer.

Mentoring...

• A relationship between a guide (mentor) and a coach which enables the coach to become more successful in all aspects of his/her coaching skills.

Mentoring involves...

• Stimulating and managing the individual growth necessary to support coaching performance in the delivery programs beyond the present levels of delivery within the Canadian hockey system.

Benefits of mentoring...

 Provides coaches with the required skills, knowledge and support to promote and sustain higher levels of performance within the coaching field.



Food for thought: Leadership, Coaching, Mentoring....

Leadership:

- Do you have be a good leader to be a good coach?
- Does a Coach have to adapt his leadership style according to the situation or his players, parents?
- Do Coaches need the same leadership style as they move up in age groups or levels?

Definition of Leadership:

- directing, motivating, and enabling others to accomplish the mission professionally and ethically, while developing or improving capabilities that contribute to mission success
- "organizing a group of people to achieve a common goal".
- "leadership is influence nothing more, nothing less."
- "The ability to influence the will of others to do something they normally would not do"



Mentor Plan & Activities

- What is that KMHA needs you to do:
 - Coaches help develop players, Mentor's help develop coaches.
 - Collectively we are smarter than we are individually
 - 104 Coaches in the association assess current and recognize and develop potential for those that express interest
 - Motivate, educate, illustrate, demonstrate
 - "Not to critique, but to contstruct"

 - Assessment's
 - Access to Resources
 - Confidence
- Plan:
 - 2 Practice observations
 - 1 Game observations
 - Notes to Coach Mentor in confidence
- Coach Mentor does not:
 - Arbitrate disputes
 - Get involved w/parental issues
 - Replace Coach






