Welcome to the 2012-2013 hockey season! My name is **Chris Bernard** and I am this year's coach for the **Kanata Blazers Minor Bantam B** team. I've been involved in sports my whole life. In hockey, I have played on top amateur teams, Canadian national champions and I've also played professionally. I have coached spring hockey, I am a skating instructor to top amateurs and NHL players in the Ottawa area and have been for the past two years. I am currently a golf professional with the Professional Golfers' Association of Canada.

Hockey is a game of skills and development. Players develop and learn the game by being given the opportunity to play in all game situations. Experiencing the highs and lows of power plays, penalty kills and end of game results makes players mentally tougher. In the end this means fair ice time to each player. But, the game must remain fun and kept in perspective.

Hockey is also a game of mistakes and my role as a coach is to try to reduce the mistakes as the season progresses. I do bring a firm approach to the rink and have an expectation that players work hard, play with discipline, encourage and support each other, and compete hard at each team event. When all the players buy into this concept, we become a "team".

There will be three (3) to five (5) team events (practice, dry-land training, games, etc.) per week. Depending on fundraising activities, families should expect to contribute team dues of approximately **\$1000** to **\$1500** over and above the KMHA registration fees to cover additional ice times, referees and tournaments.

- · Strong in battles in all areas of the ice
- Relentless work ethic
- · Keeps emotions under control
